Understanding Your Water Rate Structure

Residential water rates are made up of two components, fixed and variable charges.



Fixed Charges

These charges cover the cost of maintaining the reliability of the water system, including maintenance, repair and replacement of infrastructure, water quality testing, meter reading, debt payments, and employee salaries.

Variable Charges

These charges are based on how much water is delivered to a home and includes the cost to produce groundwater and purchase imported water, electricity, and treatment chemicals.

Affordable Rate Program

The District also offers an Affordable Rate Program to customers who meet certain income requirements. Residential customers may qualify for a discount off fixed charges per billing period on their water bill. **For more information, visit vcwd.org/affordablerates.**

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Customers should not use water from fire meters, so fireline accounts receive the higher-cost water. Construction meters have very high peaking factors and are temporary users, so they also receive higher-cost water.
